Join us at our Bent of the River Audubon Center, located at a literal bend in the Pomperaug River close to the charming South Britain Historic District in Southbury, Connecticut. The Bent, recognized as an IBA, has 700 acres of land that feature wetlands, meadows, shrubland, and mixed forest, which host a fascinating variety of plants and wildlife!

The lyrically beautiful Bent of the River Audubon Center is located on a literal bend in the Pomperaug River close to the charming South Britain Historic District in Southbury, Connecticut. The National Audubon Society is only the third owner of the Bent of the River property since European settlement. It is Federalist in style and has an estimated build date of 1790. Sometime, shortly after the Civil War, the big red barn that now houses the center offices was built.



Here are some species commonly seen in late April you may see at The Bent: Palm Warbler, Blue-winged Warbler, Pine Warbler, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher, Eastern Phoebe, Blue-headed Vireo and more.
